My name is Fred Williams, and I have only been volunteering for a few months. I currently work with the Bed and Respiratory teams.

I have had experience in volunteering before moving to Panama. When I got here, I was involved with another group, but it just seems like I wanted to do more. A couple of friends suggested Boquete Hospice and Health, and it was something I considered valuable, but I had no experience with medical equipment and health issues. Deciding to take the plunge, I cautiously volunteered. From my first experience, I realized the immense help this gives the community and saw the satisfaction of helping others, either through a difficult time to recover, or to make the final stages of life more comfortable.

I recently made a delivery to a patient that was a former volunteer. It was especially moving when the wife of the patient was thanking us so much, and I could remind her of all the comfort she gave, and that it was just karma returning the favor they gave so many when they were able. I can only hope Boquete Hospice and Health will be there if and when my need for such care arises.

To anyone that wants to volunteer with an organization dedicated to the health and comfort of the community, both Panamanian and Expat, I would suggest getting involved with this group. No prior experience is required, you can be taught what you need to know. It isn't that difficult to help the needs of the community, and there is a huge satisfaction in giving it.

Denial. Pride. Embarrassment. Fear.

These are only some of the emotions that can keep people from reaching out to Boquete Hospice and Health. Sadly, they are also the very emotions that can prevent individuals and their families from receiving the support they genuinely need.

At-home family caregivers can benefit enormously from the services BHH offers. In our case, Dr. Shannon recommended BHH in August for my husband, whose health was declining. Our goal was simple and heartfelt: to keep his care at home focused on comfort and dignity, with the hope that he might recover some of his former strength.

Jeanie at BHH helped me understand something I had never realized. The primary purpose of BHH's equipment loan program is to support the caregiver, working alongside medical providers. I had always assumed hospice services centered only on the patient. Learning otherwise made a world of difference.

BHH loaned us essential equipment that ensured my husband's care remained grounded in comfort and dignity. Their delivery and pick-up volunteers were kind, compassionate, and efficient. I cannot convey strongly enough how invaluable these resources were to us.

We received a hospital bed, blanket lifter, air mattress, a two-way monitor so I could hear him from another room, and other items that made daily care easier.

Additional equipment included an O2 concentrator, walker, and memory foam seat cushion, among other supports.

Beyond equipment, BHH provided respite care by staying with my husband so I could run errands without worry. At no time did I feel needy, inconvenient, or as if I were asking too much. Their presence felt supportive, steady, and genuinely caring.

If your medical provider recommends BHH, whether for a temporary setback or a long-term or terminal condition, do not hesitate. Reaching out may make all the difference for both your loved one and for you as the caregiver. You will be grateful for the comfort, dignity, and support they provide.

The Boqueteños Luz de Esperanza Association has been operating for eight years, during which time it has provided assistance to economically vulnerable cancer patients in the District of Boquete.

Among the activities and support we offer are:

- Outreach and assessment visits to diagnosed and referred patients.
- Home visits to patients and their families to provide companionship, moral support, solidarity, orientation, and necessary guidance.
- Educational talks for patients, family members, and volunteers, per identified needs.
- Financial assistance for transportation, medications, medical consultations, and any other therapy that contributes to the patient's recovery.
- Social gatherings with activities for entertainment, enjoyment, and relaxation for all group members, contributing to mental health.

It is important to keep in mind that patients sometimes only want to be listened to; therefore, as an organized group, we provide that space so they can express how they feel.

- Reserved for terminally ill patients (with a life expectancy of 6 months or less).
- You will need a note from the attending physician specifying:
 - That the patient is under palliative as a terminally ill patient.
 - Current diagnosis
 - Medical history
 - Doctor's phone number
 - Oxygen prescription

MOBILITY EQUIPMENT

- Short-term need (3months or less) unless hospice

SELF CARE EQUIPMENT

- Short-term need (3months or less) unless hospice
- No paperwork required




